# Important information to know: Back to School Night

### First Day of School

All students, Preschool-8th, will begin their classes on Monday, August 12th. Classes will dismiss at 1:30 on the 12th, 13th, and 14th, so please plan accordingly.

### Wednesday early dismissal

Every Wednesday, all CUES students will be dismissed at 1:30. Staff will be engaged in professional development shortly after dismissal, so it is imperative to have your child picked up on time.

# Morning arrival and traffic route

We are trying something new this year for arrival and dismissal. For arrival, as a school, we will meet together each morning for prayer and announcements in the cafeteria. All students will go to the cafeteria from 7:30-8:00 each morning. The prayer and announcements will begin at 7:55. Afterwards, students will be dismissed with their teacher and make their way back to the main building. Students will be counted tardy at 8:05. Please send your child to the cafeteria until 8:00. After 8:00, they will need to enter through the main office doors.

For morning arrival, cars will enter from Maple and loop around on the southside of the building (between the church and school) to drop off all students. Please see the accompanying map for a visual explanation. Students will not be allowed to enter the cafeteria until 7:30. Please do not drop your child off prior to 7:30 as there will be no supervision prior to then. We will let them in the cafeteria doors at 7:30.

# Breakfast

Breakfast will begin at 7:30 each morning. Breakfast is available for all students. Breakfast will stop being served at 7:50.

### Afternoon Dismissal traffic route

Dismissal will begin at 3:15. All students will be dismissed on the East side of the building (back of the school). Cars will enter on Maple street, drive to the front of the fieldhouse, make a turn and pick up students on the East side of the building. For younger students, we ask that you park in the lot and walk to pick up your child. Please see the accompanying map for a visual explanation.

### Uniforms

For the 24-25 school year, students may wear any Holy Name sweatshirt (no hoodies) with a collared polo shirt during the day as long as it is in good condition. There are many versions of sweatshirts and a range of colors and I want families to be able to wear the items that they've purchased in the past. In the future, we will move towards one design as a school. Please note that you may still wear the White and Red sweatshirts, but we will no longer offer them for sale. See uniform handout for visual guidelines.

We will also continue allowing students to wear gray quarter zips for K-5 and navy quarter zips for 6-8. The quarter zips will be available through the spirit store.

\*\*\*We are still in the process of finalizing colors for quarter zips and sweatshirts to align with the Royal Blue and Gold, which are our school colors. We will send out a communication when the colors are confirmed and share the link as well.\*\*\*

Also, beginning on Friday, August 16th, every Friday will be a FREE spirit day for students and staff. Students and staff may dress down in jeans (no sweats or athletic bottoms allowed) and wear any Holy Name t-shirt or sweatshirt, as long as it is in good condition.

# HOLY NAME UNIFORM GUIDELINES

Please read the details of this form.

# **DEAR PARENTS/GUARDIANS:**

Uniforms are required for <u>ALL students in grades PreK-8</u>. Preschool students may dress casually. Below are the uniform guidelines for the upcoming school year.

Please pay special attention to student attire on Wednesdays as it is our day for Mass. Every Friday is a <u>no cost spirit</u> <u>day</u> for all students. Students may wear dress pants or jeans. No sweats pants or athletic bottoms are allowed. Any Holy Name sweatshirt and t-shirt from any year is acceptable as long as the item is in good condition.

Apparel may be purchased from Dennis, Walmart, Target, Children's Place, JCPenney's, Kohl's, Amazon, etc.

Holy Name administration reserves the right to make the final judgment concerning appropriate school wear even if it is not specifically covered in this document or in the handbook.

If a student is not dressed according to the code, they will be sent to the school office. The student will be informed of the violation and be requested to comply with the code. Parents will be called and asked to bring appropriate attire if necessary.

## SWEATERS/CARDIGANS/PULLOVERS:

Solid navy or red with **NO prints or designs** (i.e. cartoon characters, sports attire, musicians, other colors) are allowed. Holy Name sweatshirts of any color in good condition **are acceptable**, **but hoodies are not allowed**.













PLEASE NOTE:

We will no longer offer white or red sweatshirts as part of the spirit order, but students may continue to wear them for this school year with their polo shirts.

# TOPS: BOYS AND GIRLS

Plain (no logos) White or Navy blouses/polo shirts with collars (long or short sleeve). Turtlenecks are permitted





## BOTTOMS

**GIRLS**: Holy Name plaid jumper, skirt/skort, khaki or navy jumper, khaki and navy pants/shorts (shorts must be knee length, capris are not allowed).



















**BOYS**: navy blue/khaki dress pants or slacks of cotton twill, or corduroy may be worn. Slacks and pants must fit appropriately around the waist.

Baggy or loose-fitting slacks that slide from the waist are unacceptable. If necessary, a belt should be worn to ensure proper fit.











### HAIR/ACCESSORIES

Hair must be of natural color, which includes braids, extensions, or hair wax. Unnatural colors-blue, yellow, green, pink, etc. are not allowed. Bonnets, du-rags, and bandanas are not allowed. Artificial or press on nails are not allowed. Nails should be trimmed short. Cosmetics may not be worn at school. Students will be asked to remove makeup if it is worn to school. Clear gloss is acceptable. Stud earrings are allowed.

#### SOCKS/LEGGINGS/TIGHTS

Solid Navy, Red, White, Gray, or Black socks ONLY (no other colors or printed socks allowed).

### SHOES

Tennis shoes are the only acceptable footwear for school. Opened-toed and/or open-heeled shoes are not allowed because of the extra hazard they pose to students during PE class and on the stairs.








Cars will enter from Maple Street and drive down to cafeteria entrance between the church and the school. During 7:30-8:00 a.m., all students will enter through the cafeteria doors (**Purple dot**). After 8:00 a.m., students will enter through the main school doors.

To ensure an efficient drop off, please have your child unbuckled or out of their car seat so they can get out quickly. **Please DO NOT park in the traffic line.** If you must park, please park in a designated parking zone. There is very limited space parking space in the drop off zone.

We want to ensure that all students and staff are safe, while also dismissing quickly and efficiently. Please be patient while driving through the lot. We appreciate your attention to this matter!



Cars will enter from Maple Street and drive in a line past parent parking and will make a U-turn in front of the Fieldhouse. Students will be lined up according to grade levels at the back of the building. 8th graders will be the first in line to be picked up (red dot) and each grade will follow down the line until preschool is reached on the end (blue dot). Once you have picked up your child, you will continue back onto Maple street and exit right to get onto Fontenelle or left to get back to 45th Street.

<u>Please DO NOT park in the traffic line.</u> You may park in the middle of the U-turn in the lots indicated on the map as 'Parent Parking' and come to the teacher to get your child from their line. For safety reasons, we will not release your child to you across the lot. You must come get your child.

We want to ensure that all students and staff are safe, while also dismissing quickly and efficiently. Please be patient while driving through the lot. We appreciate your attention to this matter!
