Holy Name School Renovation, Madonna at Holy Name

Our purpose is to create an all-inclusive space at Holy Name that would encompass after care for all students from The Hope Center, support services through Madonna and a Community Center. This is in one of the most under-served, lowest income areas of Omaha.

Madonna's Elementary program serves students in grades PK-8. Through this innovative partnership students with disabilities receive specialized services plus individualized, faith-based core instruction side-by-side with their siblings, friends, and neighbors! Something not available to children of this underserved low-income area of Omaha.

Madonna will be a part of Holy Name School in the Fall, 2024. This would be the third site of its kind in Omaha. To provide this specialized program, we have rooms and support space that will need to be renovated. This program will start by serving up to 6 students within the CUES School System who are eligible for special education services. Having this program in our system will allow us to serve a population that normally would attend the public school system but now would be given the same opportunities in a faith-based private school. This partnership will allow us to give every student a chance to be included and to belong. No student will be turned away for their inability to pay for education or support services.

Welcome Dr. Kimberlyn Oliver Ed.D to Holy Name

Kimberlyn Oliver is taking over as principal as Holy Name in the fall of 2024. In her tenure as an educational leader, she has served in both private and public districts as an elementary teacher, a teen support specialist for a non-profit, a program director for Upward Bound for the Papillion-La Vista School District, and as an administrator in K-12 Catholic schools.



She holds a certification in Agile Leadership, an IIRP certified facilitator in Restorative Practices, and certified as a Boystown Administrator for Well Managed Schools. At the Archdiocesan level, she served as a member of Diversity and Equity Committee and an Adult Resiliency Curriculum facilitator.

In her position of Assistant Principal, Kimberlyn designed, organized, and implemented a first ever Back to School Night Celebration which encompassed the theme of "Joy: Laughter and Learning." Kimberlyn also implemented the No Place for Hate program at Holy Name which designated the school as a NPFH campus site through student led activities. We are very excited to have Dr. Kimberlyn Oliver as the new Principal of Holy Name. She will encourage a strong value and faith based instruction. She understands the respected and diverse community Holy Name has to offer and she will do amazing in continuing to cultivate that community.

Jo Ann, throughout the entirety of her life, has been a fixture of North Omaha and has served the parochial and larger communities there well, teaching 8th graders at Nathan Hale for 33 years, serving as a hospice volunteer at Methodist Hospital, being an advocate for the voiceless unborn and the plight of motherhood, and caring for the hungry, homeless, and poor in our community through our parish chapter of the St. Vincent de Paul Society and as a member of the women's service club, Altrusa.


GRAND OPENING EVENT
